National Honor Society Individual Service Project Requirements and Guidelines

Individual members of the National Honor Society have the responsibility to choose an individual service project (ISP) in line with their particular talents and interests. This approach emphasizes the need for cooperative effort in service to the community while providing an opportunity for individuals to discover and develop their unique contributions.

Starting with the 2022-23 school year, members of the Princeton NHS Chapter must meet the following requirements for their Individual Service Projects:

- 1. ISPs cannot be activities that directly benefit a member's family.
- 2. Members cannot receive financial or other types of compensation (extra credit, membership credit, organization credit, etc.) for their ISPs.
- ISPs do not necessarily have to be completed alone, but must be outside of school groups and organizations projects. So activities that are being completed for other school organizations will not count.
- 4. All ISP activities must be approved by the chapter adviser **<u>BEFORE</u>** completion.
- 5. Members must obtain a signature and phone number from the appropriate supervising adult/chaperone to verify the completion of hours. The adult that signs off on the hours cannot be a relative of the member.
- 6. Members must complete 2 hours of service per semester of the school year.
- 7. ISP hours completion forms must be submitted to the adviser by the established deadlines:
 - a. 1st Semester Hour Due Date: Friday, December 9th
 - b. 2nd Semester Hour Due Date: Thursday, April 6th
